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

This Lenten study we will be doing three group studies in the book "Savior: What the Bible Says about the Cross" by Magrey deVega. This book and class will walk us through the story of the cross through six different lenses that we find in Scripture and that have shaped Christianity for several hundred years. These atonement theories are all Scriptural, but offer different perspectives about the work Christ did on the cross and thus offer us different ways in which we live into that reality. This six week study includes videos, as well as a book for participants to engage with.

DEAR BELOVED IN CHRIST.

As we approach the sacred season of Lent, I write to you with love and encouragement, urging each of you to reflect deeply on the significance of this holy time. Lent is not merely a ritual or a period of fasting; it is a spiritual journey that invites us to draw closer to God, to renew our hearts, and to prepare ourselves for the celebration of Christ's glorious resurrection.

Lent is a time to pause and examine the condition of our hearts. It is an opportunity for self-reflection and repentance, where we recognize our need for God's grace and mercy. The ashes we receive on Ash Wednesday are not just a symbol of our mortality, but a reminder of our dependence on God for our very lives and salvation. They call us to turn away from sin and to seek God with renewed sincerity.

The forty days of Lent, mirroring Christ's time in the wilderness, invite us to walk with Him in prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. These disciplines help us to detach from the distractions of the world and focus our hearts on what truly matters—our relationship with God and with our neighbors. Through fasting, we learn to depend not on material things, but on God alone. In prayer, we open our hearts to the Lord, speaking to Him and listening for His voice. And in acts of charity, we are reminded of our call to love and serve others, as Christ loved and served us.

Lent is also a time of renewal. It is a season for spiritual growth, for deepening our faith, and for embracing the call to holiness. Just as a garden requires pruning to bear more fruit, so too does our spiritual life require seasons of purging, reflection, and renewal. As we strive to live more fully in Christ, we are invited to let go of old habits, destructive patterns, and anything that separates us from God. The journey of Lent leads us to the cross, where we encounter the depth of God's love and mercy, and ultimately, to the joy of Easter, where we celebrate the triumph of life over death.

Our Lenten sermon series this year is titled Savior, and we will be taking a deep dive into what the Bible says about the cross. There is a lot of ways to view what Jesus' life, death, and resurrection means for us as Christians, and we call those views atonement theories. We will look at the six main ways in which we view Christ's mighty act of salvation, and allow the Spirit to use these views to renew and transform us in this season. We will also have Lenten studies that I encourage you to be a part of so that you can grow closer to God and to one another in this season.

Lent is a gift, and I encourage you to use this gift of grace as a way to one again draw close to our God. As we prepare to celebrate being Easter people, let us first be Lenten people, and do some of the hard work of our faith.

May the grace of the season of Lent lead us into the light of Christ's resurrection. Yours in Christ.
