CHRISTMAS SERVICES AT MUMC

Last year we switched things up for Christmas Eve Services and people really seemed to enjoy the different worship opportunities, so we are sticking with it again this year! All three services will be livestreamed to MUMC Online as well, and we hope that you will join us for worship and invite someone to come with you! Statistics say that people are more likely to say yes to attending a Christmas Eve or Easter service with a friend than any other service, so this is your chance to be a part of reaching new people with the Gospel of Jesus Christ! Here are the details:

December 21, 11am – Family Christmas Eve Service

Instead of having a normal Current Service on the Sunday prior to Christmas Eve, we will be having a Family Christmas Eve service. This will be interactive for the whole family and will be kid focused, meaning that we will intentionally seek to engage with our kids during this service. We invite you to come in your Christmas Sweaters and be prepared to dance, laugh, and sing as we celebrate the birth of Christ as children! There will be Candle Lighting this year as there has been in years past.

December 24th, 7pm – The Current Christmas Eve Service

Our Current Christmas Eve service will feature the same focus, encounter Jesus, but will also have the elements of a Christmas Eve service. We will do contemporary versions of some of your favorite Christmas hymns, sing some new songs, pray, and learn from God's Word. This year, we will be doing this service in the round, which always leads to a special service. The nursery will be available for this service, but there will not be childcare.

December 24th, 9pm – The Classic Christmas Eve Service

Remaining at 9 p.m., we are excited to be able to celebrate the birth of Christ with you in the same way we have in the past! The Grace Notes, The Choir, Candle Lighting and Communion will all be a part of the worship service as we celebrate the first coming of our Messiah and look for His return! We pray that you and your family and friends would join us for this traditional Christmas Eve service!

FRIENDS IN CHRIST,

As we close out November, I want to pause and offer a heartfelt word of gratitude. This month, our church has shown once again what it means to be the hands and feet of Christ. You have stepped into the needs of our community with compassion, generosity, and a quiet determination to ensure that no one in our town goes without food or without hope. Because of you, we served over 1,600 meals at Soup for the Soul in November, packed 36,000 meals with Pack Away Hunger, hosted our first Food Finders Mobile Food Pantry, and are gearing up at the time of this writing to feed 700 meals at Thanksgiving.

I thank God for you all, and how you have brought such grace and love to our community. God is good, and you are doing good work. Thanks be to God! Whether you packed boxes, donated items, made deliveries, or prayed for the families we served—each act mattered. Each act was a testimony. Together, it painted a powerful picture of what the love of Jesus looks like in real life. Thank you for being that kind of church.

Now we turn our hearts toward Advent—a season of anticipation, longing, and holy expectation. But as I look towards Advent, I see us preparing for a continued movement of God's Spirit. God has been moving in our services, with prayer and praise being given to God without abandon. As we light each candle, we remember that Christ enters into our world not from a distance, but up close... into our weariness, our search for meaning, our hunger for peace. My prayer is that this Advent season not only renews your hope and fills your home with a deeper sense of God's presence, but that you become reminded that God is with us in all things.

This newsletter is a bit different, as you will notice. We are going to an every-other-month model, so my next letter to you will come out in February. So what do we have planned for next year? I am filled with excitement for what God is preparing to do among us. New ministries are popping up weekly at our church. We now have a mini food pantry, called Feed His Sheep, that is giving out groceries that come in for Soup. We have a new card ministry, seeking to offer encouragement to those who are going through hard times. A new young adult ministry is forming. God is moving in our church, and will continue to move. We have seen God's faithfulness again and again, and I believe we are stepping into a season where that faithfulness will lead us into fresh opportunities for ministry, growth, and community impact. May we continue to follow Christ with open hands and courageous hearts.

So I thank God for your faithfulness. Thank you for loving this church and this community so well. I am grateful to serve alongside you, and I look forward to everything God has ahead for us.

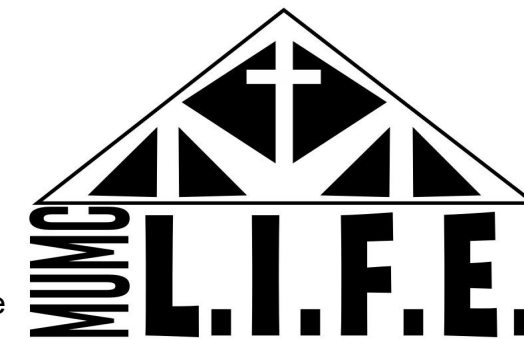
THRIVE

RECENT HIGHLIGHTS

Some highlights from the last month include...

- On November 8th, some of our youth participated in Pack Away Hunger. We had 5 high school students and 7 middle school students help with the event!!!
- During the weekend of November 8th and 9th, we had 14 high school students attend the Fall Retreat. During that weekend, we went to Top Golf and K1 Speed, had Cracker Barrel for lunch one day, and had the opportunity to stay the night at St. Luke's United Methodist Church in their youth building.
- On November 23rd, Revolution had their first annual Thanksgiving Progressive Dinner! During this event, students attended one portion of a three-course meal at three different locations. We had our appetizer at Mark and Becky Reynolds' house, the main course at Abbey Gross' office, and dessert at Mike and Ann True's house!
- On November 23rd, 648 had their Thanksgiving Cook-Off! Each group was required to make a side dish to be submitted for our special guest judges. The special ingredient for this year was bacon. A big thank you to our judges, Pastor Justin, Mike True, Brandi Fitz, and
- We did not do a lesson series in the month of November because of all the special events going on. On November 2nd, Pastor Justin came in and led 648 in communion while Revolution talked about the Fruits of the Spirit. On November 9th, 648 did not meet because of the retreat, while Revolution had a lesson on The Lord's Prayer. On November 16th, Revolution had a lesson on the meaning of Thankfulness, while 648 did a lesson on Job's thankfulness through the struggle.
- On November 2nd, we set a new Revolution record for attendance since the Covid-19 pandemic with 12 students. On that same night, 648 tied their record for attendance since Covid with 31 students. We have reached this number three times since the beginning of this school year!!!



DECEMBER AND JANUARY REVOLUTION & 648 NEWS

- In the month of December, Revolution and 648 will be exploring the story of Advent with messages from Nate Smolek, Chewie Walters, and Luke. The month of January will be the month of invites. In January, we are doing a month-long race for new members. In the month of December, we will get the average attendance for each small group and then compare it to the average attendance of each small group in January. The team with the most growth from one month to the other will win a special prize!
- On December 21st, 648 and Revolution will have their Christmas Parties during their normally scheduled times on that Sunday night. We will be doing a White Elephant Gift Exchange as well doing some Christmas cookie decorating and judging!
- High School Students are invited to our New Years' Eve Lock-In! Students can be dropped off at entrance B of the church at 8pm on December 31st and can be picked up at 8am on January 1st. The New Years' Eve Lock-In is an amazing opportunity for our students to come together and celebrate the new year!
- On January 18th, 648 and Revolution will have a combined worship night. This worship night will be very similar to what we did in the month of September. We will come together for a time of fellowship, eat some food, and play a game, before we head into Connection Court for a time of worship and a message!
- ATTENTION 5TH GRADERS AND THEIR PARENTS
 - ⇒ Starting in January, 5th grade students are invited to begin attending Revolution on the last Sunday of every month. Some of our fifth graders have been begging to come to revolution, and we finally caved in. I hope that your fifth graders are excited as we are to see some new faces!

Each devotional is \$15. ALL proceeds from the sale of the devotionals will go toward the reduction of the MUMC Capital Campaign loan!

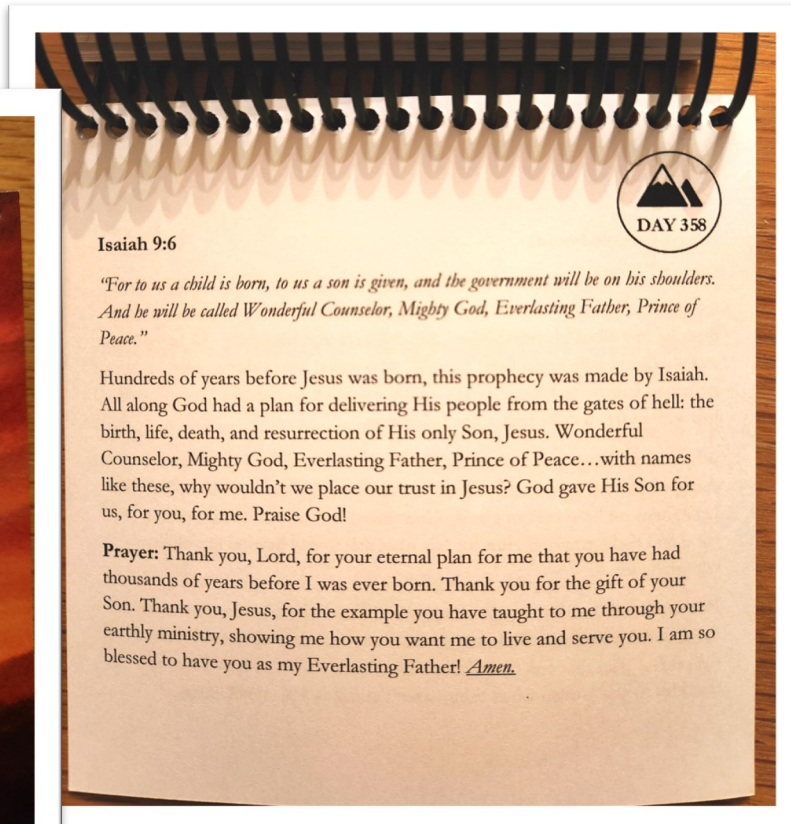
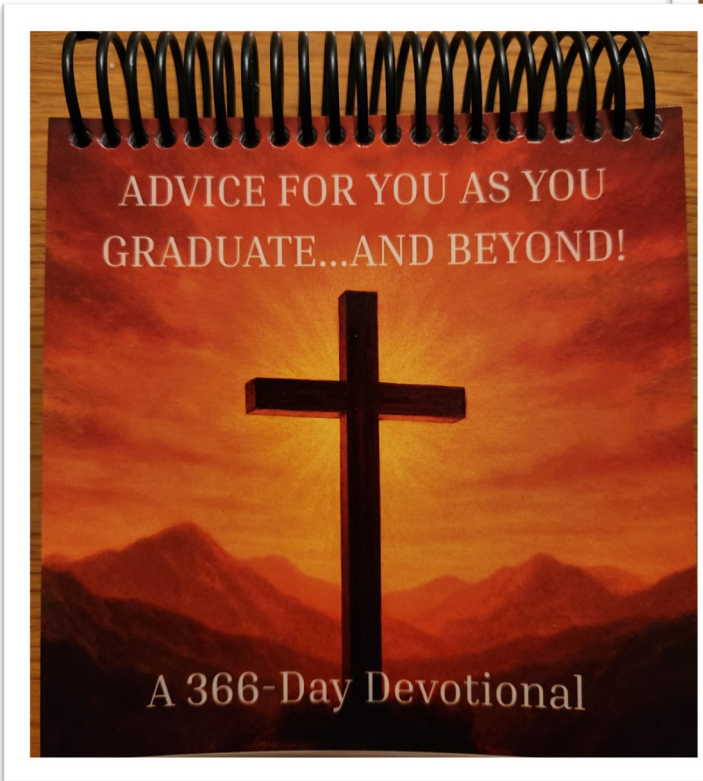
These can make excellent gifts for anyone on your list...including you!
